

The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any 4. dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

- Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner 5. or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must 6. be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

ATTENTION

The committee of the Trent Boxer Club are deeply concerned with the number of cases of Kennel Cough occurring. On seeking guidance from the Kennel Club, they have been advised to draw to the exhibitors' attention, the declaration which they have signed on their entry form. Our Veterinary Surgeon may be attendance at this show and has the authority to draw to the attention of the Committee any exhibit which has been brought to the show which he feels puts at risk other exhibits. We will not hesitate in acting on this advice and ask the owner to remove their exhibit from the show IMMEDIATELY

Referee & KC Breeders Competition JAN BAXTER (Revluc)

MARK BEARDOW

I first began showing in 1985 after leaving the Army and started with my GSD. I did well attaining his stud book number, when numbers were high. With my second GSD I was lucky enough to make him up and win 6 CC's, his last at Crufts out of veteran, from a total entry of 300.

I handled for other exhibitors and made up another 3 Champions and winning numerous CC's and reserve CC's.

I then entered Boxers in the later 90's under the BELVERN affix which proved very successful being Top Breeder 2004, 05 and 07 and runner up male D.O.T.Y 05 and Top Male BOSCARS 07 with dogs CH Belvern Demetrius, Ch/IR CH Belvern Stormy Sky, CH/AUS CH/IR CH Kirkgate Stand By Me At Belvern, and CH/IR CH Belvern Premenition, a group winner in the UK and Ireland. A champion title was also gained for a dog exported to Australia being AUS CH Berlvern Gone with the Wind.

My wife and I show a new GSD [must be mad!!!] and a Manchester Terrier who has obtained titles of UK CH. INT CH and World CH as well as Top Puppy and Top Manchester and a Group placing, unusual for a Manchester.

I award CC's in GSD's and this is my first appointment for Boxers and thank the Trent for this opportunity to judge this lovely breed. I hope everyone has a lovely day.

BETTY McDONALD

Dogs have surrounded me all my life. Starting with Border Collies and Pekingese. The first dog I registered with the Kennel Club nearly 44 years ago was a yellow Labrador Retriever called Honey.

I judged Boxers for the 1st time at Ashington & District C.S. in January 1995 and had an entry of 35.

The Scottish Boxer Club gave me my first Breed Show in February 2002.

In May 2006 I awarded Challenge Certificates at Tyne Wear& Tees Boxer Club for the 1st time.

Judging for The Trent Boxer Club will be my 6th time awarding CC's.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 8.30 a.m.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m. for Bitches, 10.30 a.m. for Dogs but not before completion of judging the Minor Puppy Bitch class
- 4. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.
- 5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the show management.
- 6. Entry Fees are First entry , Members per dog £13.00, Non-members per dog £14.00, all subsequent entries with same dog £1.00. Veteran class only £4.00, Not for Competition £1.00. Passes will not be sent out. Please enclose a stamped addressed envelope when sending your entries if confirmation is required.
- 7. Prize Money BIS £50, RBIS £25, BPIS £25, BVIS £15,
- 8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 11. <u>Best Puppy in Show</u> Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of the Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition

Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

<u>Proviso</u> For the purpose of this regulation dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

12. <u>Best in Show</u> The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

<u>Proviso</u> For the purpose of this regulation dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.

- 14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition).
- 16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor

17. Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

PLEASE TAKE CARE OF YOUR DOG.

IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered

DOG FOULING AND GROOMING WASTE Any owner, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) and / or any grooming waste at a Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

KENNEL CLUB REGULATIONS F(A) N.B. - The word "dog" includes both sexes

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, **i.e. 23rd August 2014**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) <u>Withdrawal</u>:

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20. (2) <u>Transfer</u>

- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class
- Minor Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show For doos of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Puppy: show For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Junior: show Yearling For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more first prizes at Open Novice: and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not). For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at a Championship Debutant: Show where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not). For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Graduate: Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed. For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Post Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, Graduate: whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations Limit: or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed For all dogs of the breed s for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show. Open:

The Kennel Club Breeders' Competition 2014

The Breeders' Competition offers the following Awards:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC classes 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th. Grand Final at Crufts 2015

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.

2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team

3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.

4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.

5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.

6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.

7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.

8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.

9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.

10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:

| Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes | 3 points |

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.
